As per the UGC Public Notice No. F.4-1(UGC-NET Review Committee)/2024(NET)/140648 on dated March 27, 2024, the preference in the Ph.D. admission from the academic session 2024-25 will be given to the NET score candidates. From June 2024 onwards. therefore. the NET candidates will be declared eligible in three categories as per UGC notification.

Category-1: Eligible for (i) admission to Ph.D. with JRF and (ii) appointment as Assistant Professor

Category-2: Eligible for (i) admission to Ph.D. without. JRF and (ii) appointment as Assistant Professor.

Category-3: Eligible for admission to Ph.D. programme only and not for the award of JRF or appointment as Assistant Professor.

The JRF-qualified students are admitted into the Ph.D. programme based on an interview as per the University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedures for Award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations, 2022.

For students who qualify in Categories 2 and 3, 70% weightage will be given for test scores and 30% weightage for the interview for admission to Ph.D. programmes. The Ph.D. admission will be based on the combined merit of NET marks and the marks obtained in the interview/viva voce.

The marks obtained in the NET by the candidates in Categories 2 and 3 will be valid for a period of one year for admission to Ph.D.

Note: The number of scholars will be admitted school/department-wise are given below. The seats may increase or decrease based on the availability of supervisors in the respective school/department within the university.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Step-1: Registration on SGVU website to create SID and password (visit <https://admissions.gyanvihar.org/>)

Step-2: Filling up of online Application by logging in using SID and password

Step-3: Eligibility checks of the applicant (Scrutiny of Forms and removal of deficiencies)

Step-4: Information by e-mail to applicant for the eligibility status, link of syllabus, link of Entrance Test fee (online)

Step-5: Entrance examination fee

Step-6: Issuance of Admission Card for entrance test.

Step-7: Entrance Test and Interview

Step-8: Result of entrance examination

Step-9: Result information to candidates by email and uploading of result on SGVU website.

Step-10: Issuance of provisional admission letter with semester & enrolment fee link (online).

Step-11: Enrolment generation procedure and email ID on LMS

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO Ph.D. PROGRAM

Following shall be the criteria for admission to the Ph.D. programme in the University:

1. The minimum qualifications for admissions to Ph.D. programme shall be 1-year/2-semester master's degree programme after a 4-year/8-semester bachelor's degree programme or a 2-year/4-semester master's degree programme after a 3-year bachelor's degree programme or qualifications declared equivalent to the master's degree by the corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 60% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed or equivalent qualification from a foreign educational institution accredited by an assessment and accreditation agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country to assess, accredit or assure quality and standards of the educational institution.

2. The University shall admit applicants to Ph.D. degree program through Entrance Test conducted by it.
3. Applicants who have qualified for fellowship/scholarship in UGC-NET/UGC- CSIR NET/GATE/CEED and similar National level tests shall be exempted from the Entrance Test.
4. A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled, Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.
5. Provided that a candidate seeking admission after a 4-year/8-semester bachelor's degree programme should have a minimum of 75% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade on a point scale wherever the grading system is followed. A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled, Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.
6. Candidates who have completed the M.Phil. programme with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed or equivalent qualification from a foreign educational institution accredited by an assessment and accreditation agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country to assess, accredit or assure quality and standards of educational institutions, shall be eligible for admission to the Ph.D. programme. A relaxation of 5% marks or its equivalent grade may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/Differently-Abled, Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the Commission from time to time.
7. Reservation Policy will be applicable as per Rajasthan State Government
8. Eligibility Check: A Screening Committee may be constituted to check the eligibility of the applicants. The following may be the members of the committee:
 - a. Dean Research
 - b. Admission officer /Dy. Registrar Research
 - c. Nominee of concern RAC

Ph.D. ENTRANCE EXAM PATTERN

PATTERN OF PAPER One paper containing 50% questions on Research Methodology and 50% questions related to subject specific.

Total Marks of Entrance Test and Interview = 100

Part A– Research Methodology- Marks 35, Mode- Subjective (5 questions out of 7, each of 7 marks)
Duration 1.5 hr

Part B– Subject Specific – Marks 35, Mode Subjective (5 questions out of 7, each of 7 marks)
Duration 1.5 hr
